During your stay in Dauin you will spend approximately five weeks on your IDC and Learn to Teach program and you will devote seven weeks to your RA internship. All in all this package gives you the best of both worlds.




When you arrive you will start with your Research Assistant (RA) program with Institute for Marine Research (IMR). We are an accredited PADI Dive Center and can teach you all courses from Open Water Diver until Divermaster. Our main focus however is marine research in the Philippines. We are a grassroots non-profit organization that aims to conduct long-term and fine-scale research on coastal marine ecosystems, using this scientific evidence to educate, transform and encourage locally led marine conservation strategies within the country. We define threats to critical marine habitats in the Philippines and develop locally led marine conservation strategies. IMR's goal is to build, inspire and educate the local communities striving to have a long-term impact on the Dauin coastal areas.



Once you have gotten to know the reefs of Dauin like the back of your hand and have refreshed all your diving skills you get the opportunity to excel on your Instructor Development Course (IDC). Your IDC runs through Instructor Development Philippines (IDP), a reputable and professional program. IDP is a collaboration between Atmosphere Resorts & Spa and Liquid Dumaguete, both 5* PADI Career Development Centers. You will spend half of your time on the IDC at Liquid and the remaining half at Atmosphere. This follows through in your complimentary Learn to Teach Program during which you will teach at both resorts besides training the new batch of Research Assistants at IMR.

YOUR RESEARCH ASSISTANT PROGRAM

Those undertaking the Research Assistant + Instructor Development Course training will kick-start their career as a marine conservation scientist and PADI professional by immediately immersing themselves in a rigorous four week training program required to become a Research Assistant for the Institute. By becoming an IMR Research Assistant in your first month, you will drastically improve your underwater buoyancy control, awareness, communication and leadership skills to prepare you for your training as a Instructor candidate.

Our Research Assistant Course trains you in both the practical and theoretical knowledge required to lead each component of our Dauin Municipality Long-term Reef Monitoring Project. It was designed with the purpose of tracking fine-scale changes in the overall reef community over time. Surveys for the Project involve four tasks: benthic assays for coral cover, impacts assays, diver-operated video surveys of fish diversity and biomass, and three-dimensional (3D) models of structural reef complexity.

Research Assistants (RAs) will not only learn research skills that will enhance their prospects as future conservationists, but will learn how to communicate science through school education and community outreach programs.

The last three weeks of your RA program you will begin a series of "research rounds". These rounds consist of one-week blocks whereby you will have the opportunity to take complete leadership of each research component of our long-term reef-monitoring project, as well contributing to the production of IMR's research outputs and conservation efforts. During these rounds you will act as a mentor to our upcoming Research Assistants and Divemaster Trainees as they are trained to become leaders in the diving industry. You will be mentored throughout this entire period by the staff at IMR, and be treated as a fellow member of IMR's scientific team. IMR prides itself in training Research Assistants to leave with the skills and confidence necessary to lead a marine conservation project anywhere in the world.







YOUR INSTRUCTOR DEVELOPMENT COURSE

Your PADI Instructor Development Course is your next step towards your dreamjob. We at IDP understand that it is a big decision to make where to complete your IDC as it might have an impact on your future career. That is exactly why we give you the highest quality course in the best facilities in the country. With onsite dive training pools, your open water site on your door step and fully equipped airconditioned classrooms with the latest technology we will make your IDC as convenient as possible.

Your IDC program consists of five components:

1. IDC eLearning and self-study (recommended minimum 7 days)

Part of your IDC will take place online through the latest IDC eLearning program. You will also have access to digital dive theory study tools and skill demonstration videos with the revised 2019 performance requirements before you arrive in Dauin. All in all plenty of time to get yourself prepared.

2. IDC Preparation Days (3 days)

We provide you with the opportunity to take part in our three day complimentary Preparation Days. During these days we revisit Dive Theory questions, practice your skill demonstrations as well as refresh the major Advanced Open Water and Rescue exercises. This will ensure you are 100% ready to step into your IDC.

3. EFR and Care for Children Instructor Courses (2 days)

The EFR Instructor rating is a required part of becoming an OWSI. During this course we will refresh all of your skills as an Emergency First Responder but also give you the tools and knowledge to start teaching your own students. It is a valuable course to take just before we really get started with the IDC as much of the teaching methodology is similar to the actual IDC teaching presentations. We provide you with a low-stress environment and guarantee lots of laughs, a great way to learn about a more serious topic!

4. Instructor Development Course (11 days)

The IDC actually consists of two separate programs: the Assistant Instructor Course (AI) and the Open Water Scuba Instructor Course (OWSI). For your convenience we have combined them into one cohesive program. If you have the AI rating already there are options to just complete the OWSI however.

During these 11 days you will learn how to teach your own students the knowledge and skills ranging from the Open Water Diver to Divemaster Courses. You will enhance your skill demonstrations even further besides learning how to organize, set up and control a class of simulated students. Team work is key to your success and this will be reinforced throughout by seeing how a successful team of Course Directors and Master/IDC Staff Instructors work together. You benefit from the experience of our multiple award-winning CD's and Staff Instructors.

We cover workshops about the Discover Scuba Diving program as well as perfection your ability to conduct Advanced Open Water and Rescue Diver Course skills. We will ensure you are taught to the highest standards and emphasize environmental awareness through neutral buoyancy. But your IDC is not just about teaching PADI Courses; it is also about turning you into an active ocean advocate. For this reason every IDC candidate can partake in our complimentary Project AWARE Dive Against Debris Instructor Course.

5. Instructor Examination (2 days)

The Instructor Examination (IE) is the final step to becoming an instructor. An impartial PADI examiner will fly in to evaluate your teaching assignments and written exams. After 16 days of training you are well prepared for the exams. Everything that happens on an IE happens in exactly the same way on your IDC, so there are no more surprises! At the end of the two days you will receive that magical handshake from the PADI examiner and call yourself an Open Water Scuba Instructor!

RESEARCH ASSISTANT PROGRAM FACILITY

The Institute for Marine Research is one of the leading marine research facilities in the country with state of the art research equipment.

Classroom

In your training to become a Research Assistant for the Institute for Marine Research, you will be taught by experienced Marine Scientists in the biology, ecology, physiology and identification of phyla within our coral reef ecosystems. You will learn the impacts that face coral reef ecosystems both on a global scale, as well as the localised disturbances affecting the reefs of Dauin. Through this knowledge you will be able to formulate thought provoking research questions in order to study this fragile ecosystem.

Dive transportation

At IMR we have our own dive truck which drives us to the dive sites in Dauin. So there is no damage from anchoring or fuel run offs! It is an efficient way to visit the marine protected areas in Dauin.

Research methodology and equipment

The Dauin Municipality Long-Term Reef Monitoring Project has been designed with the purpose of tracking fine-scale changes in the overall reef community over time. During your program you will be using state of the art equipment like our Diver Operated Stereo Video System (SVS). We use the SVS for fish density, fish 3D distribution mapping biomass and fish size measurements. This innovative technology allows our Researchers to record fish species with more precision and higher accuracy than the traditional Underwater Visual Census techniques and it efficiently quantifies the abundance and size of reef fish.

To understand more precisely the nature between structural complexity and reef health, we use 3-Dimensional (3D) Modelling as a tool to quantify topography, rugosity and other structural characteristics that play an important role in the ecology of coral reef communities.





Our 12 week Research Assistant + Instructor Development Course costs a total of **Php 360,500.00** per person.

TRANSPORTATION

Both Institute for Marine Research and Instructor Development Philippines are located in Dauin, a small village about 20 minutes south of Dumaguete City. Dumaguete is one of the largest cities on the island of Negros, situated in the Visayas region of the Philippines. No matter how you reach Dumaguete, we will pick you up from the airport or ferry/bus terminal.

There are many domestic connections to Dumaguete City whether it is via airplane, ferry or bus.

Domestic flight routes

First and foremost Dumaguete City (Sibulan) Airport serves travelers to/from Manila (NAIA) and Cebu City (Mactan) International Airports. Philippine Airlines and Cebu Pacific Airlines are the only two companies with flights to Dumaguete. There are many connecting flights to other areas within the country like Palawan, Coron, Boracay and Leyte.

Domestic ferry routes

There are also daily direct ferry connections with Cebu City, both during the day (Oceanjet; via Tagbilaran - Bohol) as well as overnight (Cokaliong and George & Peter Lines). There is a weekly 2Go Ferry plying the route between Manila and Dumaguete however the flights are much faster and have competitive pricing. There are many daily ferries connecting Dumaguete and Siquijor Island which makes for a fun day trip destination as well.

Domestic bus routes

Ceres Liner is the main bus operator in the Visayas region and provides transportation to Malapascua Island (via Cebu City), Moalboal, Cebu City, Bacolod City, Sipalay and all other destinations on Negros Island. They can be recognized by their distinctive yellow color and are an efficient but cheap method of transportation.

International flight routes

Both Manila and Cebu International Airports are directly connected to a variety of destinations within Asia as well as a number of countries in Europe, Australia and North America. In Asia there is a wide choice of carriers next to the large intercontinental operators. Lowcost airlines including AirAsia, Tiger Air and Cebu Pacific fly to major cities like Hong Kong, Kuala Lumpur, Singapore and Bangkok as well as popular tourist destinations in Southeast Asia and China.

Getting around in Dauin

Dauin is a relatively small community but with a decent infrastructure. You will be the most mobile if you rent a scooter for about Php 5,000 per month. But not to worry if you do not know how to drive a scooter. We organize transfers to all dive sites every day. If you like to leave base at any time we can call a habal-habal (motorcycle taxi) or a tricycle (tuktuk) for you or you can just hitch a ride whenever we venture out of base. From the center of Dauin there are buses, jeepneys and tricycles to Dumaguete City.



ACCOMMODATION

Institute for Marine Research Base

During your entire program you will stay at IMR Base, located at the foothills of Mount Talinis for a nice cooler climate. Base consists of one dormitory (max. 10 pax) and one private room with twin beds and shared bathroom. In total our base can accommodate 12 RA's/Fellows. Internet is available on base and at most resorts within Dauin.

The onsite kitchen is staffed and provides you with three meals a day from Monday - Saturday. On Sundays you have a day off during your RA program which means it is time for some daytrips, R&R at one of the beach resorts and exploring the many waterfalls, lakes and hot springs.
